

a. Speech and presentation from Jaci Anderson, Project Manager from C.A.R.E.18 Los Angeles (www.CARE18.org), an organization dedicated to fight human trafficking. (CARE 18 is an 18-month initial project to address human trafficking of minors in Los Angeles with a victim-centered approach and a focus on safe housing and wrap-around services.)

b. Speech and presentation from John Rocha, Resident Agent in Charge for the Department of Homeland Security, Homeland Security Investigations. Human trafficking is a form of modern-day slavery, and involves the use of force, fraud, or coercion to exploit human beings for some type of labor or commercial sex purpose. Every year, millions of men, women, and children worldwide—including in the United States—are victims of human trafficking. Victims are often lured with false promises of well-paying jobs or are manipulated by people they trust, but instead are forced or coerced into prostitution, domestic servitude, farm or factory labor, or other

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types of forced labor. The U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) is responsible for investigating human trafficking, arresting traffickers and protecting victims. DHS initiates hundreds of investigations and makes numerous arrests every year, using a victim-centered approach. DHS also processes immigration relief through Continued Presence (CP), T visas, and U visas to victims of human trafficking and other designated crimes. (Please join ICE and the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) in the fight against child sex trafficking. If you suspect human trafficking, please call 866-DHS-2-ICE.)

c. Speech and presentation by Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Special Agent Ronald Schloegel. According to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), "Human sex trafficking is the most common form of modern-day slavery. Estimates place the number of its domestic and international victims in the millions, mostly females and children enslaved in the commercial sex industry for little or no money. The terms human trafficking and sex slavery usually conjure up images of young girls beaten and abused in faraway places, like Eastern Europe, Asia, or Africa. Actually, human sex trafficking and sex slavery happen locally in cities and towns, both large and small, throughout the United States, right in citizens' backyards."

d. Speech and presentation by Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA) Special Agents Vijay Rathi and Chris Wilson. The mission of the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) is to enforce the controlled substances laws and regulations of the United States and bring to the criminal and civil justice system of the United States, or any other competent jurisdiction, those organizations and principal members of organizations, involved in the growing, manufacture, or distribution of controlled substances appearing in or destined for illicit traffic in the United States; and to recommend and support non-enforcement programs aimed at reducing the availability of illicit controlled substances on the domestic and international markets.

e. Speech and presentation from the California Highway Partol (CHP). The California Highway Patrol was created in 1929 to provide uniform traffic law enforcement throughout the state. Assuring the safe, convenient and efficient transportation of people and goods on our highway system is still our primary purpose. California is comprised of culturally diverse people of all ages. Yet, we all have this in common: We all use roads and highways throughout the state to go places, conduct business, engage in commerce, or simply enjoy California's beauty. Help us do it safely! The California Highway Patrol (CHP) is actively working to reduce collision and fatality rates in California.

f. Speech and presentation by LAPD Van Nuys Division. It is the mission of the Los Angeles Police Department to safeguard the lives and property of the people we serve, to reduce the incidence and fear of crime, and to enhance public safety while working with the diverse communities to improve their quality of life. Our mandate is to do so with honor and integrity, while at all times conducting ourselves with the highest ethical standards to maintain public confidence.

g. Speech and presentation by State Senator Bob Hertzberg or senior staff. Robert Hertzberg represents nearly 1 million San Fernando Valley residents of Senate District 18, which includes the following: part of Burbank and the following communities in Los Angeles: Arleta, Granada Hills, Hansen Dam, Lake View Terrace, Mission Hills, North Hills, North Hollywood, part of Northridge, Pacoima, Panorama City, Sherman Oaks, Studio city, part of Sun Valley, Sylmar, Toluca Lake, Valley Glen, Valley Village, Van Nuys, the city of San Fernando and Universal City.

h. Speech and presentation by State Assemblyman Adrin Nazarian or senior staff. Adrin believes in civic engagement and the importance of giving back to his community, he has served on the boards of several community based organizations including the East Valley YMCA and the YWCA. Adrin was one of the founding members of Generation Next Mentorship program which worked with local public schools to give young people alternatives to a life of gangs and drugs. Adrin and his wife, Diana, live in Sherman Oaks with their sons Alex and David.
