- Naloxone is an easy-to-use, lifesaving antidote to reverse opiate overdose due to prescription opiates or heroin.
- Naloxone is a safe medication that blocks the effects of opiate overdose to revive a person to a sober state.
- Naloxone has no abuse potential and has no effects on someone who has not taken opioids.
- It is safe for the common person to possess and administer after going through a briefworkshop.
- Discuss the California Good Samaritan Law, which encourages those who witness an overdose not to run but to call 911.
