Discussion and Possible Action: Proposed demolition of one Single Family Dwelling (SFD) with a detached garage and 2 building with total of 3 residential units followed by new construction of a 4-story, multi-family dwelling with 20 units and ground level parking located at 14629 & 14631 W. Erwin Street in Van Nuys which is within a Tier 2 TOC Zone (DIR-2019-1323/ENV-2019-1324-EAF). Applicant: Hildur Atladottir of Minarc. Planning Dept: TBD

Informational Item: Presentation by Abby Stone, Design and Engagement Lead, LA-Más), which is part of a collective of other non-profits that launched a program called the Backyard Homes Project to help average homeowners build equity and become providers of affordable housing. Our incentive program offers homeowners an affordable "one-stop-shop" for the design, finance, construction, and leasing of a new backyard home in the City of Los Angeles. In exchange for support in building a backyard home, homeowners will be required to rent the new unit to a Section 8 tenant for at least 5 years.
