PUBLIC INPUT AT NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCIL MEETINGS The public is requested to dial *9 if participating by phone or "Raise Hand" if participating by computer, when prompted by the presiding officer, to address the Board on any agenda item before the Board takes an action on an item. Comments from the public on agenda items will be heard only when the respective item is being considered. Comments from the public on other matters not appearing on the agenda that are within the Board's jurisdiction will be heard during the General Public Comment period. Please note that under the Brown Act, the Board is prevented from acting on a matter that you bring to its attention during the General Public Comment period; however, the issue raised by a member of the public may become the subject of a future Board meeting.  - a) PLUM recommends sending a letter of support to the Planning Department for the proposed project at **15350 W. Sherman Way. Case No. ZA-2021-10540-CUW.** Proposed installation of a new rooftop wireless telecommunication facility. T-Mobile is requesting a CUP allowing installation of 9 antennas and 9 RRUs, 1 Microwave dish, 4 equipment cabinets, FRP screening, and 1 utility H-frame. Also seeking CUP to WTP with 12 feet above roof deck in lieu of 10 feet required by LAMC section 12.21 A21. Applicant: T-Mobile West, LLC. Representative: Tony Kassas of Synergy Development Services. *Digital copies of project documents can be found*

 - b) PLUM recommends sending a letter of support to the Planning Department for the proposed project at **14606-14612 W. Sylvan St. Case No. DIR-2022-2620-TOC-HCA.** Propose to remove asphalt commercial parking lot and construct a new multi-residential building with 5 stories, 34 units + ADU, and a parking garage on the first floor with 28 auto, and 31 long-term. Project is using TOC Program Tier 3. Requesting density bonus to build 34 units (with 4 units designated for extremely low-income households) -- vs. allowable density of 20 units. Requesting three additional incentives: height increase of 11 ft. (from 45 ft. to 56 ft.), two side yard set-back reductions of max. of 30%, and up to 25% decrease of required open space. Applicant: Jonathan Azal, Sylvan Tower LLC. Representative: Armin Gharai, GA Engineering Inc. *Digital copies of project documents can be found*

- e) Recommendation from Parks, Open Space, and Environment Committee hopefully joined by recommendation from the Beautification Committee at its meeting on July 12th for the VNNC to approve sending the following letter in support of planting native trees in Van Nuys to lead staff at the City of LA Urban Forestry Division Rachel Malarich, Hector Banuelos, and Stephen Duprey, David Miranda, and Councilmembers Martinez, Krekorian, and Raman:

Whereas Los Angeles faces a biodiversity crisis wherein over 90% of local butterflies, songbirds, and other pollinators have disappeared in the last century due to the replacement of local flora with non-native plant and tree species, and

Whereas native landscaping plants and trees can thrive in our urban environment while providing all the benefits non-native trees can offer in terms of canopy shade to offset the heat island effect, beauty, and shade comfort for humans, while providing the only path to sustainability for biodiversity, water and energy savings, and elimination of soil amendment runoff pollution,

Therefore, the Van Nuys Neighborhood Council appeals to the County and City of Los Angeles, all applicable government agencies, public-private partnerships, and private parties planting in public space to discontinue the practice of planting non-native landscaping plants and trees except in situations where plants and trees are designed to produce food for human consumption or provide a designated recreational playing field, and henceforth these same parties only plant 100% California native landscaping plants and trees within Los Angeles County and City, and specifically within the stakeholder boundaries of the Van Nuys Neighborhood Council.
