b. Discussion and possible action regarding taking a position on the draft Oil and Gas Drilling Ordinance

Background: Los Angeles City Planning (City Planning) released the proposed Oil and Gas Drilling Ordinance (Oil Ordinance) for public review and feedback. fsIn response to City Council File No. 17-0447, the proposed Oil Ordinance would amend the Los Angeles Municipal Code to prohibit all new oil and gas drilling activities and make any existing extraction a nonconforming use in all zones of the City.

The proposed Oil Ordinance would phase out these oil drilling activities, which are known hazards to public health and safety, by immediately banning new oil and gas extraction and requiring the removal of existing operations after an amortization period.

NCSA adopted the following position statement on Sept 11th:

The NCSA applauds the city on its proposed Oil and Gas Drilling Ordinance. We urge the city to enact it promptly. We also urge the city to:

- Phase out oil wells on a schedule similar to Culver City's five year phaseout.
 That city's amortization study found that most older wells had already paid off their costs. Los Angeles is performing its own amortization study as required by council motion 17-0447, but it would be surprising and disappointing if LA's phaseout was much slower than Culver City's.
- Promptly plug and abandon each phased out well at the operator's expense.
- Engage public health experts to report on community impact of <u>highly toxic</u> <u>substances such as hydrofluoric acid</u> used in oil wells, and draft regulations to prohibit any which pose a significant risk to the surrounding neighborhood.
- Encourage redevelopment of well sites in a way that benefits the community, with neighborhood input.
