A reminder to those attending: during Public Comment, you may hear colorful language that some might find offensive. The Van Nuys Neighborhood Council has no ability to control or regulate the content of speech that is protected under the 1st Amendment.

Public comment is limited to a maximum of 2 minutes per speaker per item with a maximum of 10 minutes total per meeting, unless adjusted by the presiding officer of the Board. Actual time for each comment will be recorded in 30 second increments (i.e., 30 sec., 1 min., 90 sec., 2 min.). Stakeholders are asked to respect the timekeeper when you are alerted that your time has expired.

Van Nuys Neighborhood Council Boardmembers are reminded not to cut off, interrupt, or otherwise engage with Stakeholders during their allotted time for Public Comment.

Speakers shall limit their comments to matters relevant to the item on the agenda. The Chair may rule that the speaker is out of order if the comments are not germane to the item under consideration.

Speakers shall direct their comments to the Board (not to an individual).

Stakeholders are welcome to offer comments -- both during General Public Comment and Public Comments on specific agenda items -- but the Van Nuys Neighborhood Council requests that Stakeholders do not disrupt the meeting for other Stakeholders in attendance. We ask that Stakeholders refrain from calling out or participating in behavior that would disrupt the Board Meeting of the Van Nuys Neighborhood Council. Stakeholders will be given an initial warning. There may be two additional warnings before the stakeholder is asked to leave the meeting due to disruptions of the meeting.

All public comments must be made into the microphone at the lectern to facilitate the capture of a clear recording of the meeting.

John Hendry's 20 Legacy Items for VNNC

—Wildflowers on Sepulveda Dam
—ValleyVue hiking path on the north-south Sepulveda Dam berm
—-"Calatrava style" bridge across 405 (An east-west single steel cable span that works like a sundial—as it runs east-west across the road—Redding, CA has one and it's popular tourist attraction)
—-Sepulveda Dam—LA River interpretive plaza for "Friends of River"
—Van Nuys Plaza (mural to help manage on bank —across from Braude Plaza—saving "Western Wear" which was Van Nuys' first building in 1911 as Bank of Van Nuys
—Walking Tour of Van Nuys (Hendry has done tour—considering a San Fernando tour (in cooperation with Museum San Fernando Valley)
—-Return of the Christmas Angels—The 1950-1980 Bethlehem Star Parade led to 150 6' high Christmas angels posted on VN BI light standards (can't find more than 3 today)
—Saving the BANK of AMERICA With it's Millard Sheets mural, a "Van Nuys at 50" diorama of Van Nuys and the Indians to "Van Nuys goes into space".
—-the Whitsett legacy. William p Whitsett., cofounder of Van Nuys, gave 2 unique buildings, Van Nuys' 10 story building used by CHAMPS, and a high art building on Archwood to oversee the Vons—Butler Brothers shopping center—(now "99 Cent Store—Adrays").
—Sylvan St corridor (from Kester to Hazeltine). Unique 1920's corridor needing signage For 1926 Library, 1935 Post Office, 1911 Bank of Van Nuys, a 1915"first settlers' house)
—-First Christian Science Church—Hamlin St Cedros—beautiful Southern California casual style (theatrical seating)church in need of preservation
—-/Cedros trees lining street Dating from the 1911founding of Van Nuys, the trees lined the back side of the Whitley Mansion, the baronial home of HJ Whitley who founded Van Nuys.

—-Restoring and preserving Sherman Way's palms and pines. Planted from 1911 onward to flank the Valley's Great Boulevard, the palms and pines needed a Valley-wide sprucing up—special sidewalks, tree cutouts, signage.
—-Turning the 1970's US Post Office into a Van Nuys Mercado/-an open interior place for incubator restautants for all those judges? Jurors, attorneys, LAPD officers, city planners, city employees all could lunch there.
—-Honoring the Tongva ("First Nations") with signage commemorating Pacoima Wash, Tujunga Wash, Cahuenga Pass, Topanga Canyon as named historic sites named for "first citizens".
—-The Mulholland Drive Centemnial Car Rally". 2024 marks the "centennial of Mulholland Drive"—"What better Than all of us, riding in the back of a classic 55 Thunderbird, 65 Mustang, or whatever down Mulholland Drive???
What dreams we should have done
What little we've done with our time.

Both city staff and property owners behave as though trees are expendable. Yet trees are of great value. Trees have a calming effect, give respite from the heat. They sustain our diminishing birds and butterflies.

Trees are essential to clean the air. They remove (sequester) carbon.

Prioritize our trees and woodlands. Everyone needs trees, not just the rich.

Communities with an extensive urban forest have lower crime rates.

Trees should not be considered decoration – they contribute to our health.

It takes 20 years for a new tree to mature. Why not try to keep the ones we have?

BOE sent a survey offering sidewalk amenities – trees were not a choice. Why?

Property owners have the legal right to cut down most of their trees – and they do! Controls exist in other cities.

Single-family property owners demolish the house AND ALL the trees, just to rebuild a house. All by-right.

Designers should be required to preserve perimeter trees on new construction.

City Planners usually don't advise building around trees. Why not?

Urban Forestry is not planting trees. Their budget was cut. Can we fix this?

Property owners severely cut back canopy and harm trees. Nobody stops them.

Parking lot owners cut away the tree shade. No inspections, no enforcement.

Protected trees are secretly cut down on weekends and nights. How do we stop this?

Sidewalk Repair Program does not consider NEW ways to save big trees. Yet other cities have solutions.

Replacement trees are nearly always a smaller canopy species. We are downsizing the urban forest!

Without any submission of plans, trees get clear-cut during demolitions — why not require all trees

Without any submission of plans, trees get clear-cut during demolitions – why not require all trees remain?

New construction could be built around at least some of the trees, but most often trees are just cut down.

Driveways get relocated to where there is a tree in the way. Why is this allowed?

Why not give big street trees extra room by giving up a parking space. Trees are more essential than cars.

UFD and RAP have a much tinier percentage of the city budget compared to other cities. Let's fix this! Paris planted 4,000 trees to get ready for their Olympics. How many is LA28 planting?

The proposed Olympic site at the Sepulveda basin expects to remove trees. Can't we solve this another way?

Trees are critical to the next generation – please let's not cheat the future LA residents.

Trees are the only infrastructure that increases in value over time. An investment!
